The ethnographic research conducted in the INTEGRA partner countries (Cyprus, Greece, Italy, Portugal and Spain) originated an innovative set of **National Reports** that analyse the process of ageing out of care in EU southern countries. The findings of this European research are highlighted and reviewed in the **White Paper Ageing out of Care into Autonomous Living**, which proposes tailored solutions to challenges, trends and needs that undermine a successful transition into adulthood.
